

École Elizabeth Rummel School opened in September 1991, as Pre-Kindergarten to grade 6 dual track school offering both English and French Immersion programs. A reorganization of divisional schools during the mid-1990 saw ERS become a K-3 School. During the 2002-03 school year, grade 4 was added to the complement of classrooms. During the 2013-2014 school year, ERS again became a K-3 school with the focus being an Early Learning School. In 2016-2017 ERS celebrated its' 25th Anniversary!







As of January 8, 2020, ERS had a total enrolment of **326** students. ERS is a dual track school offering both English and French Immersion programs. 45% of students are in the English Program and 48% of students are in the French Immersion program. 6% are half and half.





How satisfied are you with the quality of education students at your school are receiving?



How satisfied are you with the quality of teaching at your school?



How satisfied are you with the opportunity for parents or guardians to be involved in decisions about their children's education?



Overall School Priorities 2019-2022

- Teachers are engaged in the fourth year of instructional design based on the Teaching Effectiveness Framework with Formative Assessment as a lens.
- Focus on Literacy goals to reduce the achievement gap for all students Learning Plan
- Professional learning opportunities are focused on universal strategies such as Response to Intervention (RTI) to support all students. Teachers are involved in bi-monthly team meetings to review data and to share strategies with each other
- RTI- expanded to all grade levels as of Fall of 2016.
- Continue school-wide scheduling to support team meetings
- Create systems and structures to address student needs





Overall School Priorities 2019-2022

- Review of common reporting and assessment practices from K-6 with Galileo Educational Network
- Classroom teachers writing Individual Program Plans (IPPs) with support from Learning Support Teachers.
- Time in the schedule provided for regular reviews of the IPPs with the learning team
- Shared Vision of Instructional Excellence guiding teacher's professional practice that impacts student achievement.
- Teachers are engaged in professional learning networks and with Galileo in order to develop pedagogy to engage students to be more actively in their learning.






